Now imagine 10,000 motorcycles going down the middle of that road for 3 hours while those people just keep waving, cheering and holding signs saying things like, "welcome home", "potato, potato, potato", "ride hard, ride loud" and all the while, you are laughing and smiling too! That's what it was like to have the privilege of carrying our El Cajon HOG flag in the Parade of Bikes in Milwaukee. A huge **THANK YOU** to our Director, **Mike Scott** and to all of you for allowing **Arlen Foster** and me to carry our flag in that parade in Milwaukee. What a tremendous thrill and compliment. We were honored to be there for our Chapter. The people of Milwaukee were fabulous and the events were plentiful – all over the city for 5 days!



My thanks also goes to two of our fellow LOH members and friends, **Karen Holden** and **Kimberlie Lehman** for braving the elements and riding to Milwaukee together for the 100<sup>th</sup>. Amazingly, the three of us rode together for over 3200 miles and never once saw another "all women" group of bikes! 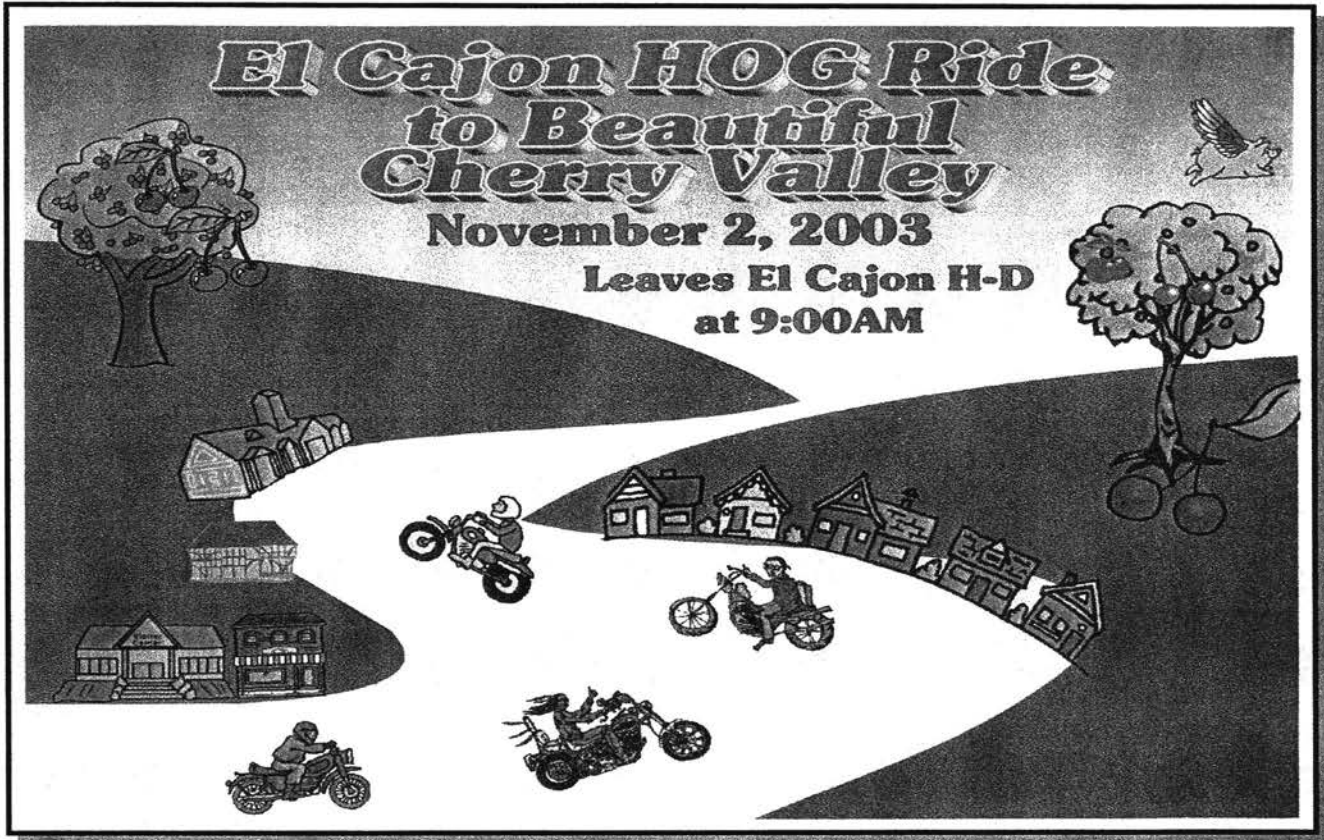

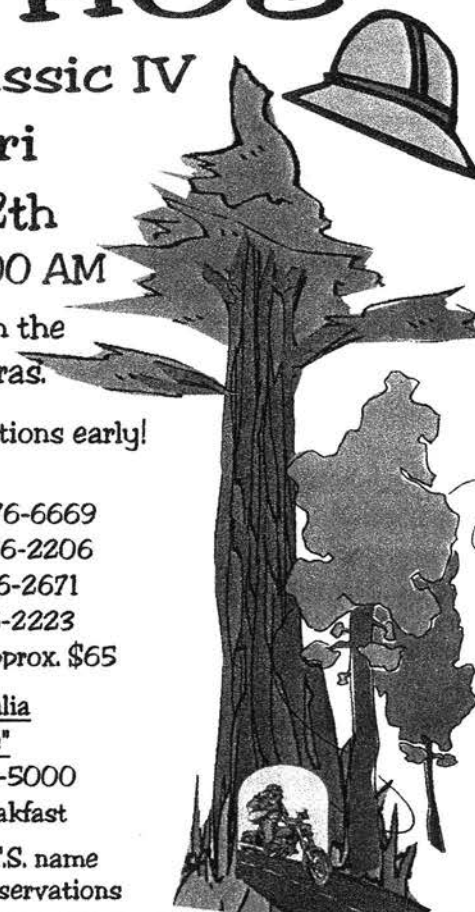
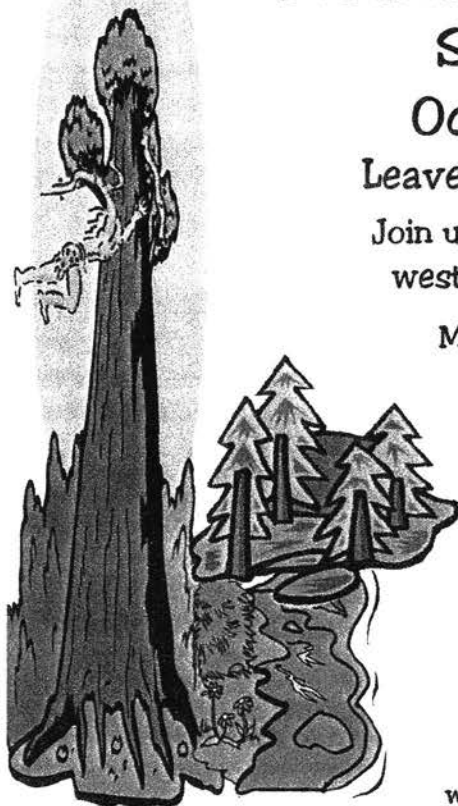

## Fall Classic Checklist

**Motorcycle:** Please be sure that your rubber is up to the task and that your shocks are properly adjusted to the extra weight. Your battery is also very important, so check the water level and have good connections. I know that everyone is dutifully maintaining their equipment so this is pretty much a moot point.

**Clothing:** Is it going to be hot? Yes. Is it going to be cold? Yes. Is it going to be beautiful? Yes! Is it going to RAIN? NO. Pack accordingly you all-seasoned riders, and if you're not, talk to someone who's been down the road a bit and get some ideas that maybe you haven't thought of.

**Attitude:** We're going on vacation so enjoy yourself. Be patient, we're going to be a bigger herd than usual.

**Traveling:** When on the highways I like to ride in the number 2 lane. It moves at a constant rate and allows people to pass us as well as allows cars to merge onto the road without cutting us off. Yes the cages will be confused as to what we're doing just let it go. Your safety is defensive and proactive.

**Stops:** Time is adequately given to be ready to roll as a group, but if you need more time please let someone know. Or if you are having difficulties with your bike please make that determination as soon as possible so we can get you back in the saddle. Arrangements can and will be made to help! Emergency clll phone numbers will be available the day of the ride.

**Punctuality:** Let's get real. Do the best you can.

## Fall Classic Sierra Safari Itinerary by Kim Wallace

**T**ake a moment to look around; our little rides have grown into full blown events. So with this observation it will come as no surprise that more attention to fellow riders becomes more important. If this is your first ride with E.C.E.T.S. be sure to introduce yourself around, don't be shy you're with your H.O.G. family. We make it a point that no one gets left behind so be sure that someone knows who you are, and try to match up with someone who is new also. Why? Because your new friends are just waiting, and sharing the adventure together will only enhance the experience. With that little bit of sermonizing over lets get ready to ride.

We will have a pre-ride meeting at 6:45 am and leave El Cajon H-D promptly at 7:00 am.

The first order of business will be getting out of town during rush hour traffic. I-8 west to 163 north to 15 north is the safest way for a group our size to head north out of town. How do I know this? I drive for a living in this town.

The first stop will be at the Deer Springs exit north of Escondido where we will pick up our north county riders and take a short break, i.e. pee. The route will take us up 15 past Temecula to the 215, through Moreno Valley, down Box Canyon to the 10 which connects to the 15. You've done this countless times going to Vegas so it should be no surprise. Because of the size of our group we will split up for breakfast. The time should be about 9:30. Half of the group will go to the I-Hop at the first exit and the other half will dine at Denny's just up the road. We need about an hour and a half to get everyone fed, believe me it takes that long. The meeting up place will be the Mobil station at the Denny's exit. We should all try to be there at 11:00. Then we ride north through Cajon Pass to the 395 north exit and on to beautiful Kramer Junction. Sorry, but no stopping here. We head west on the 58. If you must take a break you can catch us in Mojave. The Road House next to the Chevron in Mojave will be the next break. Allow for one hour and be fueled up ready to go at about 1:30. This is where we start to get out of the stinking desert and into the scenic. The 58 west over the Tehachapi Mountains is truly bitchen with railroads snaking around and through the mountains. Of course the wind farms are ever present and the highway is a lot of fun in its own way. We will be turning off at Caliente, just shy of Bakersfield. This turn comes up pretty quick so be on your toes. Once we're off the 58 the country takes on a whole different look and feel. It's So.Cal. but feels like another state. We are riding through open range and the speed will be reduced due to the conditions, mainly curvy roads and the occasional cow. Yes, you're in cow country and the unofficial Cowboy museum is here. A few more curves, up and over, and soon Lake Isabella comes into view. We're only a few minutes from our nights destination, Kernville. Upon entering Kernville the Kern Lodge will be on your right, the River View Lodge on your left, the Hi Ho Lodge will be down the road from the fire station about half a mile. The Pine Cone Inn and Kernville Inn's are immediately on your right past the stop sign. We made it! There is a general

store across from the Pine Cone Inn as well as gas pumps. Please take time to fill up so you won't feel rushed in the morning. Everyone should be about half starved by now but don't worry, a buffet has been planned for 6:00 pm. Cost: thirteen bucks which includes a beverage. Beer and wine are on your own. Where is the dinner? At Ewing's, nestled up to the Kern River with a spectacular view. I can't remember the name of the street but I'll get you there.

### Day Two:

Breakfast is on your own, this is a laid back community so don't expect fast service, judge it for yourself. As always, this is your ride and this itinerary is just a guide, if you want to go sooner than the group, then by all means please don't let us slow you down and we'll all catch up again. This also holds true for those who want to go at a slower pace. With that said, the group will leave at nine o'clock and head north along the Kern River. About five miles out of town is a little bridge that's ideal for picture taking and so every effort will be taken to stop here. It will be crowded so be careful. If your bladder gets the best of you there are several port-a-potties along the way. Our next planned stop will be just beyond Camp Nelson at the only wide spot in the road. There's a little café and they were warned about us coming, we'll be the talk of the town. As the crow flies we're only minutes away from Visalia; however we're not crows, and it'll take us a long time to traverse the paved goat trail, known as the 137. Take your time, the Holiday Inn will be waiting just off the 198 and 99, and just think how good the hot-tub is going to feel. Dinner is on your own, and conveniently enough, there's a restaurant in the lobby. The same one where breakfast will be served.

### Day Three:




Sequoia National Park here we come. Get your wallet out it's going to be about twenty bucks. And while you've got your wallet out, lunch will be provided by, Linda Kyles' brother-in-law. Yes we try to think of everything and mostly we get it right. Sam and Linda will meet us in the park at the what's its name picnic area inside the park. Sometime before we ride into the park a list will be circulated to get everyone's order. NO you don't have to buy a lunch and yes you can spend more if you want to at any other site in the park. This will be the most convenient and economical way to feed the masses. After lunch please take time to look around, we are all owners of the National Park system, and I think it's important to see how the caretakers are treating it. The sun should be getting pretty low by now and it's time to think about the last night PARTY. Where? I don't know but someone always does. This is one of the traditions we all enjoy and what a great way to recap the days events. Wait, I think I left everyone still in the Park. Oh yea, exit the park and follow the signs to Badger to the southbound 245 to the westbound 198 and presto your back at the Holiday Inn. Like I was saying before, this is your ride and is just one of the many benefits and pleasures of being a member of El Cajon HOG, your participation ensures your fun.

### Day Four:

The earlier you leave the sooner you get home, simple as that! Leave when you want. If you'd like a take no prisoners ride home I'll be leaving at 7:00 a.m. The last day is always a self-regulated ride home so please be careful and get ready for Laughlin Alternative IX in April.
